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*Dear Glen Cove Residents and Homeowner Association Members residing near the
Glen Cove Waterfront Park Site,*

I would like to take this opportunity to update you on the Glen Cove Waterfront Park Project. As you're aware, it has been a long and arduous process to finally reach the construction phase for this important project. Currently the first phase of the removal of the invasive and non-native vegetation has been completed with the second phase to occur in Spring 2012 which will target any remaining vegetation slated for removal. The relocation of the existing 8 inch city water main is essentially completed up to the point of connection to City water services. The contractor is moving slowly on grading the site pending approval from the California Department of Fish and Game to work in the riparian areas during the rainy months. We should see the demolition of the Stremmel Residence and caretaker's structures in the next month with the anticipated completion of the park project in Spring 2012.

An important issue that has come to the forefront is unauthorized access to the site. Please be aware that access during construction is strictly prohibited to anyone other than construction related personnel. This is necessary to prevent individuals from injuring themselves and also to prevent unauthorized use and vandalism to equipment on site.

GVRD is also requesting that all residents support us in reporting to the police (Dispatch 707-648-5293) any individuals or groups that appear to have no legal reason to be on the site. Please discuss this issue with your neighbors and seek their support in keeping this area safe and under proper control during construction. The District appreciates your support and looks forward to providing your community with a park we all can be proud of.
